**TUE** JANUARY 25

Ch. 27) Who is supposed to look after the lamp in the tent of meeting, outside the veil in front of the ark of the testimony, and in the presence of the Lord from evening to morning?

Ch. 28) Chapter 28 records the rules concerning the holy garments of the high priest.

Ch. 35) How were the materials provided to make Jehovah's tent of meeting and various utensils and articles?

Ch. 36) And Moses called Bezalel and Oholiab and every craftsman in whose mind the LORD had put skill, everyone whose heart stirred him up to come to do the work. And they received from Moses all the contribution that the people of Israel had brought for doing the work on the sanctuary. They still kept bringing him freewill offerings every morning, so that all the craftsmen who were doing every sort of task on the sanctuary came, each from the task that he was doing, and said to Moses, "(.....) for doing the work that the LORD has commanded us to do."

Ch. 38) In the days of the Israelites, there was no glass. What did they make the mirror of?

**FRI** JANUARY 28

Ch. 39) According to all that the LORD had commanded Moses, so the people of Israel had done all the work. And Moses saw all the work, and behold, they had done it; as the LORD (.....), so had they done it. Then Moses (.....) them.

Ch. 40) What does the following verses imply about the people of Israel?  
Throughout all their journeys, whenever the cloud was taken up from over the tabernacle, the people of Israel would set out. But if the cloud was not taken up, then they did not set out till the day that it was taken up. For the cloud of the LORD was on the tabernacle by day, and fire was in it by night, in the sight of all the house of Israel throughout all their journeys. (v.36-38)

\*Leviticus guided the people of Israel on how to serve God and how to live holy lives as God's people.

Leviticus Ch. 1) Chapters 1-5 record the five sacrifices offered to God (burnt offering, grain offering, peace offering, sin offering and guilt offering).  
A burnt offering is an offering of incense by burning a sacrifice. It symbolizes the reconciliation with God and devotion to God. Fill in the blank.  
He shall lay his hand on the head of the burnt offering, and (.....).

Ch. 2) A grain offering is an offering of grain, in addition to a burnt offering and a peace offering. When offering a grain offering, it is said, "Salt the grain offering." What does salt mean?

Ch. 5) A guilt offering is an offering where a concept of compensation is added to a sin offering.

A guilt offering is offered if anyone commits a breach of faith and sins unintentionally in any of the holy things of the LORD (V5:15-19) and if anyone commits a crime against his/her neighbor (v6:1-7)  
How much should be added to a guilt offering as compensation?
