Ch. 5) What was the plague that occurred when the Philistines took the Ark of the Covenant and stored it in Ashdod?

Ch. 6) After the Philistines decided to return the Ark of the Covenant, it was loaded onto two milk cows and sent to Beth-shemesh. In verses 9-10, what is the reason for keeping the calves in the house and using two milking cows for this?

Ch. 7) The Philistines attack Mizpah, where the people of Israel had gathered to pray. However, after victory by God's special grace, Samuel erected a stone to commemorate it. Write its name and meaning.

Ch. 8) When the people ask for a king to rule over them, Samuel prays to the Lord. What God says is that the people's request is to abandon whom?
