Ch. 103) 125) In this psalm, a song about going up to the Temple, it is said that the LORD God cares for those who trust in the LORD. "Those who trust in the LORD are like Mount (\_\_\_\_\_), which cannot be moved, but abides forever."

Ch. 126) This poem sings the thrill of liberation from the Babylonian captivity. "Then our mouth was filled with (\_\_\_\_\_), and our tongue with shouts of (\_\_\_\_\_)"

Ch. 127) In this psalm, the psalmist deals with vain labor not with God. "Unless the ( ) watches over the city, the watchman stays awake in vain. It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for he gives to his beloved sleep." (I pray that the Lord will protect our lives who works hard every day and eats the bread of hard work)

Ch. 128) This poem sings about the happiness that God-fearing families enjoy. Find and write the blessings of those who fear the Lord and walk in his path.

Ch. 131) This poem is a song that compares the relationship between God and the saints to a mother and an infant. Just as a baby is still and serene when in its mother's arms, who should we look to from now to eternity?

Ch. 132) This poem is a song of dedication of the Temple, sung by the Temple pilgrims. Who should be in the blank below?

Ch. 133) This poem sings of the beauty of brotherly unity and fellowship. In verse 1, put 'family', 'mokjang', and 'our church' in the word 'brother' and read the words. "Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!"

Ch. 134) This psalm is a song of blessing to the LORD's servants who stand in the Temple even at night. When we raise our hands toward the sanctuary and bless the LORD, what is the result?

135) This psalm emphasizes that the only One that Israel should praise is God, the Creator of heaven and earth and the ruler of history. How many times are the words "Praise the Lord" and "Bless the Lord" recorded?

**WED** June 29

Ch. 136) In this poem, we give thanks and praise for God's character, protection, and salvation. If there is something that you are grateful for recently, continue after verse 26, write 136:27 as your own confession.

Ch. 137) This poem is a poem written in reminiscent of the Babylonian captivity. Why did they stop singing when they hung up the lyres from the willow tree when they were singing praises to God?

Ch. 138) This psalm was written by David after he conquered the neighboring countries in gratitude for God's grace.

- 1) What does God do on the day we pray?
- 2) What does God do when we are in trouble?

Ch. 139) This psalm is a song of praise about God the Creator, and the poet sings the character of God. "Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to (\_\_\_\_\_), you are there! If I make my bed in (\_\_\_\_\_), you are there! If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there your (\_\_\_\_\_), shall lead me, and your (\_\_\_\_\_), shall hold me."

Ch. 140) This poem contains the poet's hope to save him from the persecution of the enemy who is trying to harm him. What does the LORD say to the afflicted and to the needy, respectively?

Ch. 141) This psalm is a psalm of David waiting for God's salvation. How did David, who was in a difficult situation surrounded by wicked people, ask God for help? (Hint verse 2)

Ch. 142) This psalm is a prayer that David, who was in the midst of unjust suffering, prayed for God's salvation in a cave. How does David confess in verse 5, as it seems that no one knows him, there is no refuge for him, and no one cares for his soul?

Ch. 143) This psalm is a psalm of David who repents with a broken heart. Make verse 8 of this psalm into a praise song, and then listen to the song. Listen to "<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ptecYG2wXhY>" on YouTube.

Ch. 144) This psalm is a song about the blessings those who trust in God will receive. Write down the blessings that the people who make the LORD their God will receive. (Verses 12-15)

Ch. 145) This psalm is David's hymn that sings about the greatness and character of God. "The LORD is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in ( ). He fulfills the desire of those who ( ) him; he also hears their cry and saves them."

**FRI** July 1

Ch. 146) Psalms 146-150 are psalms that start with Hallelujah and end with Hallelujah. In this poem, the poet sings the blessing of those who depend on God. Whom does the poet exhort us not to trust? Whom should we lean on?

Ch. 147) This poem sings about the greatness of God that fills the universe. In this psalm, find and write what God is not pleased with (verse 10) and what pleases Him (verse 11).

Ch. 148) In this poem, the poet asks to praise God, the Creator of all things. In this poem, find out why all creation should praise God.

Ch. 149) Continuing from Psalm 148, this psalm asks us to praise God for saving sinners. Find and write down the words that are the basis for praising God whenever the saved saints get together.

Ch. 150) This psalm concludes the final chapter of the Psalm, urging us to praise God, the King of the universe and the Lord of all, by mobilizing the places, instruments, and people to sing praises. Who should praise the LORD?
