

MON August 15

Ch. 31) This chapter records the restoration of Israel (verses 1-22) and the restoration and blessing of Judah (verses 23-26). Where is God said to write His laws when He establishes a new covenant with the house of Israel?

Ch. 32) In this chapter, Jeremiah is declaring God's calamity to come upon Judah, and when he is imprisoned by King Zedekiah, he hears the word to purchase the land and buys a field in Anathoth. What did God tell Jeremiah to buy land? (Hint v. 44)

Ch. 33) This chapter records the restoration of Judah and Israel and the promises of the Messiah. "A righteous Branch" is a symbol of Christ who is to come into the world. Who does this Branch spring up for?

Ch. 34) This chapter is a prophecy about King Zedekiah. Find all prophecies about King Zedekiah.

- 1) I will give this city over to Babylon.
- 2) You, too, will not escape from his hand and will surely be taken captive.
- 3) You will die in peace and not be stabbed to death.
- 4) People will consider your death justified.

TUE August 16

Ch. 35) In this chapter, the obedience of the people of one tribe is taken as an example, and the disobedience of the people of Judah is further revealed and rebuked. According to Jonathan's rule, what is the name of a people who lived in tents without building houses and did not grow vineyards or drink wine?

Ch. 36) This chapter is about the 'Record of the Scroll'. Who wrote down on a scroll all the words that God had spoken to Jeremiah?

Ch. 37) This chapter records Jeremiah's imprisonment while preaching the word of judgment. Who did not send Jeremiah to Jonathan's prison, but kept him in the court of the guard and provided food for him?

Ch. 38) This chapter records the events in which the prophet Jeremiah, who prophesied the Babylonian invasion and the destruction of Jerusalem, was imprisoned in a cistern. Who rescued Jeremiah from the cistern?

WED August 17

Ch. 39) This chapter records the destruction of Judah, who did not turn back, as a result of God's judgment. What is the name of the wretched king who suffered the following? "The last king of southern Judah, blind and chained and taken to Babylon, where his sons were executed in the sight of his father."

Ch. 40) This chapter records what happened to Jeremiah after the fall of Jerusalem. After Judah was destroyed by Babylon, Jeremiah, who was released, did not go to Babylon, 1) where did he go and 2) with whom did he live?

Ch. 41) This chapter contains the account of Ishmael's assassination of Gedaliah and the pursuit of Johanan. Write down the evil deeds Ishmael did at Mizpah.

Ch. 42) In this chapter, Johanan and his companions on their way to Egypt ask Jeremiah to pray for intercession, Jeremiah tells them the answer he received from God. God told them not to go to a country where the rest of the people will go to live and die there. Which country is it?

THU August 18

Ch. 43) In this chapter, the incident of Johanan and his companions ignoring God's Word and dragging Jeremiah down to Egypt is recorded. Jeremiah foretells the future conquest of Egypt by whose hand?

Ch. 44) This chapter warns against the idolatry of the Jews who went down to Egypt by Jeremiah. Find irrelevant prophecies of what will happen to those who go down to Egypt without listening to God.

- 1) The LORD will bring them back to their homeland.
- 2) They will all perish in the land of Egypt.
- 3) Everyone from the lowest to the highest will die by the sword and by famine.
- 4) They will be subject to curses, surprises, ridicule, and shame.

Ch. 45) This chapter takes place in the 4th year of King Jehoiakim, the same as in Chapter 36. What was God's promise to Baruch, who wrote all the words in a book as Jeremiah told him?

Ch. 46) Chapters 46 to 51 are the prophecies of judgment against the 9 Gentile nations around Judah. This chapter prophesies the destruction of the Egyptian army. Which country will invade the land of Egypt and destroy Egypt?

FRI August 19

Ch 47) This chapter prophesies the destruction of the Philistines. When Babylon in the north came like a flood and invaded the south, the Philistines were completely destroyed. The remnant of the Philistines flee to the island, but in the end they all die. What was the name of the last island they fled to?

Ch. 48) This chapter prophesies the destruction of Moab. Why did Moab perish and never become a nation again?

Ch. 49) This chapter prophesies the judgments of Ammon, Edom, Damascus, Kedar, Hazor, and Elam. "Behold, one shall mount up and fly swiftly like an eagle and spread his wings against Bozrah, and the heart of the warriors of (.....) shall be in that day like the heart of a woman in her birth pains."

Ch. 50) This chapter prophesies the judgment that Babylon will face. When Babylon is destroyed, and when God brings Israel back to his pastures, Israel's iniquity will not be found, and Judah's sin will not be found. Even if you look for it, you can't find it. Why?

SAT August 20

Ch. 51) This chapter continues to record God's judgment on Babylon. Seraiah read and informed them of the book Jeremiah had given them about the destruction of Babylon, and then put a stone in the book and threw it into a river. What is the name of the river?

Ch. 52) This chapter restates the fall of the city of Jerusalem. Who is this person?

- 1) The king of Babylon released him from prison,
- 2) As a captive, he ate at a table with the king even though he was wearing a prison uniform,
- 3) received a certain amount of living expenses until he died,
- 4) the king of Babylon showed kindness to him.

Lamentation Ch. 1) This chapter contains the lamentation of the prophet who grieves over the devastation of the fallen city of Jerusalem. This book is composed of 5 chapters. What is the common word starting in Chapters 1, 2, and 4?

Ch. 2) This chapter refers to God's justice in judging Jerusalem, and contains the heart of the prophet who proclaims God's mercy and compassion. "The LORD has done what he (.....); he has carried out his (.....), which he commanded long ago; he has thrown down without pity; he has made the (.....) rejoice over you and exalted the might of your (.....)."
