

MON September 5

Ch.45) This chapter records the holy district in the center of the land of Canaan - the sanctuary (verses 1-8), the duties of the king and the people (verses 9-17), and the regulations concerning the various feasts (verses 18-25). How many days did God tell the Israelites to keep the Passover, and what kind of bread should they eat?

Ch. 46) The ordinances for the Sabbath and new moon Sabbaths and other general feasts or holy assemblies and sacrifices are recorded. In verses 13-15, what is the burnt offering offered every morning?
(Just like the Israelites who prepared burnt offerings every morning and offered sacrifices, we should have time to meet with God every day.)

Ch. 47) This chapter introduces the water flowing out of the temple. Which of the following is not an event that occurs wherever the river flows?

- 1) Swarms of living creatures will live wherever the river flows.
- 2) There will be large numbers of fish.
- 3) Fruit trees of all kinds will grow on both banks of the river
- 4) But the swamps and marshes will become fresh.

Ch. 48) This chapter records the distribution of the entire territory of Israel to the 12 tribes, and the 12 entrances and exits of the city of Jerusalem where the temple of God is located. What is the name of the city that will be built in restored Israel? (meaning "the LORD is there") Hint: Jehovah-shammah

Ch. 1) Daniel and his three friends are taken to Babylon. They are renamed and they refuse food offered to foreign gods and eat vegetables instead.

"But Daniel (_____) not to defile himself with the royal food and wine, and he asked the chief official for permission not to defile himself this way."

Ch. 2) In this chapter, Daniel interprets King Nebuchadnezzar's dream. After Daniel asked for time to interpret the king's dream, what did he ask his three friends to do when he returned to his house?

Ch. 3) Daniel's three friends who did not bow down to the image of gold are thrown into the blazing furnace. How many people were thrown into the blazing furnace, and how many walked around in the fire, unbound and unharmed?

Ch.4) This chapter records Nebuchadnezzar's second dream.

"Now I, (_____) , praise and exalt and glorify the King of heaven, because everything he does is right and all his ways are just. And those who walk in pride he is able to humble."

Ch. 5) The fallen king Belshazzar cannot interpret the writing on the wall and finds Daniel. Daniel interprets the letters as meaning the destruction of Babylon. What are the two things King Belshazzar did wrong which are recorded in verses 1-4?

Ch. 6) In this chapter, Daniel is thrown into the lions' den for disobeying the new decree of King Darius. How many times a day did Daniel pray toward Jerusalem, even though he knew that a decree was published that forbids him to seek any gods except King Darius?

Ch. 7) This chapter records the vision of the four beasts and the second coming of the Messiah. The four beasts represent the four kings who will rise in the world, and the fourth kingdom (the Roman Empire) was terrifying and frightening even to Daniel. However, this country will eventually perish.

"But (_____), and his power will be taken away and completely destroyed forever."

Ch. 8) Daniel interprets the vision in the third year of King Belshazzar. To whom do the two-horned ram and the shaggy goat each refer?

Ch. 9) In this chapter, Daniel offers intercession while fasting to solve the people's sin problem. According to the angel Gabriel, when was Daniel's prayer answered?

Ch. 10) This chapter records the background of Daniel's vision and the appearance of the Messiah. What was the vision given to Daniel in the third year of King Cyrus, and how long did Daniel mourn when he heard it?

Ch. 11) In this chapter, Daniel prophesies about the fate of the nations around Israel. From the Old Testament to the New Testament in which Jesus appears, the Bible is silent about 400 years of history, but that period is filled with prophecies.
