Ch. 5) 1) Sixth vision: A vision of flying scroll
Whose house does the flying scroll enter and judge it?

2) Seventh vision: A vision of a woman in a basket
Where does the evil (woman) in Jerusalem go? (This means that not only the temple will be rebuilt, but Jerusalem will be cleansed.)

Ch. 6) Eighth vision: A vision of four chariots
What do the horses in each chariot represent?

Ch. 7) "They made their hearts () lest they should hear the law and the words that the LORD of hosts had sent by his Spirit through the former prophets. Therefore great anger came from the LORD of hosts."

TUE September 27

Ch. 8) This chapter proclaims the full restoration of Israel in the future, in the name of "the Lord of hosts." How many times does the word "the Lord of hosts" appear in this chapter?

Ch.9) Verses 1-8 give a prophecy about the destruction of the nations, and verses 9-17 describe the Messiah.

As Jesus entered the city of Jerusalem to carry the cross, he rode on a donkey, and the people said, "Blessed be Hosanna! He who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel!" (John 12:12-15). Which verse in chapter 9 prophesied this?

Ch. 10) Following chapter 9, chapter 10 emphasize the grace and blessings that will come to Israel by the blessed reign of the Messiah.

"I will bring them home from the land of (), and gather them from (), and I will bring them to the land of () and to (), till there is no room for them."

WED September 28

Ch. 11) This chapter is the parable of the two shepherds. The first shepherd is the good shepherd who will feed "the flock doomed to slaughter" and the second shepherd is the bad and false shepherd who abandoned the flock. Find and write down the characteristics of the false shepherd. (Hint verses 15-17)

Ch. 12) This chapter prophesies about the salvation and restoration of Israel. At the second coming of Christ, who died on the cross, you will also see the one who pierced him, and on that day the Jews mourn and weep.

"...when they look on me, on him whom they have pierced, they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for an only child, and weep bitterly over him, as one weeps over a ()."

Ch. 13) This chapter proclaims the message of Israel's repentance and promise that a remnant will become a people of the covenant. When Jesus, the shepherd, died on the cross, it was prophesied that the sheep would be scattered and would be refined like silver or gold. When they call on God's name in their suffering, what is God's answer?

Ch. 14) This chapter records the tribulation that came to the church just before the Second Coming of Christ and the blessings resulting from the reign of the Messiah after that. What is the Lord's calamity upon all the people who struck Jerusalem?

THU September 29

MALACHI Ch. 1) After emphasizing God's love (verses 1-5), Malachi points out the evil deeds of Israel's disregard for God (verses 6-14).

Which of the following is not a sin of Israel's priests and people?

- 1) They despised His name.
- 2) They did not fast.
- 3) They offered polluted food.
- 4) They offered lame or sick animals.

Ch. 2) This chapter records the punishment for the fallen priests (verses 1-9) and the warning against the people of Judah who practiced lies (verses 10-16).

"For the lips of a (.....) should guard knowledge, and people should seek instruction from his mouth, for he is the messenger of the LORD of hosts."

Ch. 3) This chapter records the description of the day of the Lord's coming (2:17-3:6), the exhortation to tithe (verses 7-12), and Israel's pride and God's judgment (verses 13-18).

"Then those who feared the LORD spoke with one another. The LORD paid attention and heard them, and (.....) was written before him of those who feared the LORD and esteemed his name."

Ch. 4) This chapter conveys the message of God's promise.

"Behold, I will send you (.....) the prophet before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes."

(This "prophet" refers to John the Baptist, who appears after about 400 years of silence after the Old Testament prophet Malachi)
