

MON October 3

Ch. 9) The Pharisees criticize Jesus when they see him calling Matthew and being with many tax collectors and sinners. However, Jesus quotes the Old Testament words "I desire mercy, and not sacrifice" to the Pharisees, who only valued the religious form. Write down Hosea 6:6 that Jesus quoted.

Ch. 10) "And do not fear those who (.....). Rather fear him who can (.....)."

Ch. 11) In verse 14, Jesus says John the Baptist is "Elijah who is to come." Write down Malachi 4:5.

Ch. 12) After Jesus healed the sick, He "ordered them not to make him known." (Matthew 8:4, Matthew 9:30, Matthew 12:16) Choose three appropriate explanations as to why.

- 1) He refused to use his divine healing powers any longer.
- 2) He did not want to be known only as a miracle worker.
- 3) He did not want to make his ministry only physical and political.
- 4) This was to prevent the healing ministry from becoming an obstacle to his essential ministry, evangelism.

Ch. 13) In verses 44-50, three parables about the kingdom of heaven are recorded. Write down 3 things that heaven is like.

Ch. 14) Choose all that we can learn through the miracle of Jesus feeding the 5,000.

- 1) Jesus Christ is the true bread of life.
- 2) Anyone who comes to Jesus will share in the grace of salvation.
- 3) Once we come to Jesus we obtain material abundance.
- 4) Jesus gives wonderful and abundant blessings through even our small contributions.

Ch. 15) The Pharisees, who followed the Mosaic Law, strictly separated the food they ate, but did not take seriously the words or attitudes that came out of their hearts. So Jesus said in verse 11, "it is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but what comes out of the mouth; this defiles a person."

"But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this defiles a person. For out of the heart come (.....), (.....), (.....), (.....)."

Ch. 20) When the mother of the son of Zebedee asked to have his sons sit on the right and left-hand sides of the Lord's kingdom, Jesus rather tells the purpose of his coming to this earth. Write that verse.

Ch. 21) This chapter is about the first two days of the Holy Week that begins with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem.

Write the title of what Jesus did on the first and second days of Holy Week.
