

MON) JANUARY 30

Ch. 7) "For () and () I have taken from the people of Israel, out of the sacrifices of their peace offerings, and have given them to Aaron the priest and to his sons, as a perpetual due from the people of Israel."

Ch. 8) This chapter records the consecration of Aaron and his sons as priest for the first time in the history of Israel. Among the procedures of the ordination ceremony, what does Moses consider the most important? (Hint: v.10-12, v. 15, v. 30)

Ch. 9) After 7 days of ordination ceremony Aaron and his sons offer the first sacrifice. "And Moses said, "This is the thing that the Lord commanded you to do, that the glory of the Lord may appear to you."(v.6) How did the glory of the Lord appear after all the offerings? (v. 23-24)

Ch. 10) Nadab and Abihu die because they offered "unauthorized fire before the Lord." This fire from God killed people but did not burn their clothes.(v.5) Write down verse 5.

TUE) JANUARY 31

Ch. 11) "For I am the Lord your God. Consecrate yourselves therefore, and be (), for I am (). You shall not defile yourselves with any swarming thing that crawls on the ground. For I am the Lord who brought you up out of the land of Egypt to be your God. You shall therefore be (), for I am ()."

Ch. 12) Chapter 12 records purification after childbirth.

"And when the days of her purifying are completed, whether for a son or for a daughter, she shall bring to the priest at the entrance of the tent of meeting a lamb a year old for a burnt offering, and a pigeon or a turtledove for a sin offering." (v.6)
"And if she cannot afford a lamb, then she shall take (), one for a burnt offering and the other for a sin offering."

Ch. 13) Who diagnoses leprosy, examines it and pronounces it clean? (It is not to cure it, but to be purified from it.)

Ch. 14) What shall the leprous person bring to the priest when he is healed from the leprosy?

- 1) Two live clean birds : Offer one and release the other one in the wild. It means sacrifice and freedom.
- 2) Cedarwood : It means life over death.
- 3) () : It means vibrant life.
- 4) () : It means you are healed from the bad smell of the leprosy.

Ch. 15) Chapter 15 records Laws about bodily discharges.

Leprosy is clearly visible from others whereas the bodily discharges are not. What does it imply that there are extensive laws about purification of bodily discharges which is not visible to others?

Ch.16) Chapter 16 is about the Day of Atonement. Once a year, the high priest enters the Holy Place to atone for the sins of the entire Israelites.

"And Aaron shall cast lots over the two goats, one lot for () and the other lot for ()."

Ch. 17) "And you shall say to them, Any one of the house of Israel, or of the strangers who sojourn among them, who offers a burnt offering or sacrifice and does not bring it to () to offer it to the Lord, that man shall be cut off from his people."

Ch. 18) "You shall not do as they do in the land of (), where you lived, and you shall not do as they do in the land of (), to which I am bringing you. You shall not walk in their statutes. You shall follow my () and keep my () and walk in them. I am the Lord your God. You shall therefore keep my statutes and my rules; if a person does them, he shall () them: I am the Lord."

Ch. 24) Verses 1 to 9 are about the lamps and the breads for the Tabernacle.

Ch. 27) "But a firstborn of animals, which as a firstborn belongs to the Lord, no man may dedicate; whether ox or sheep, it is (.....)." (v. 26)

Numbers Ch. 1) Numbers records the Israelites wondering in the wilderness.

On February 1 of the second year after the Exodus, a census is conducted at Mount Sinai. All Israel is organized to march through the wilderness in an orderly manner to conquer the land of Canaan.

Which tribes were not included in the census, and what were their duties?

Ch. 2) "The people of Israel shall camp each by his own standard, with the banners of their fathers' houses. They shall camp facing (.....) on every side."

This means God centered life.
