

**MON) August 28**

Ch. 29) This chapter is a prophecy against Egypt. Egypt will be destroyed by King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon. What animal is likened to Pharaoh of Egypt?

Ch. 30) Prophecy against Egypt continues. Whose arm does God say he will strengthen, and whose arm will he break?

Ch.31) This chapter continues to warn of the fall of Egypt through the fall of Assyria. What is the biggest cause of the destruction of Assyria, once called the cedar of Lebanon?

Ch. 32) Jehovah knew that Pharaoh was a lion (a competent ruler with courage, ambition, and a sense of justice), but in reality, what does he say is like living in the middle of the sea?

**TUE) August 29**

Ch. 33) Ezekiel, the watchman, is urging the captive Israelites to repent. It seems that the people of Israel are gathering to hear the words of the prophet, but what is the reason why they do not act according to the words?

Ch. 34) God rebukes the Israelite shepherds for not caring for the sheep. Write down the things that God promised to do for the sheep by being the shepherd himself.

Ch. 35) This chapter is a prophecy against Mount Seir and Edom. Edom was a Gentile tribe that harassed the chosen Israelites the most. Find and write the words that prophesy that the judgment on Edom will be thoroughly and completely fulfilled.  
 "I will make you a (.....)  
 desolation, and your cities shall (.....).  
 Then you will know that I am the Lord."

Ch. 36) This chapter is a prophecy of the restoration of the Israelites. However, what is the one thing the Israelites must do in order for God's will to be done?

**WED) August 30**

Ch. 37) This chapter records the vision of dry bones coming to life and the parable of uniting two sticks into one.

- 1) What was the vision shown to Ezekiel to prophesy the spiritual recovery of Israel?
- 2) What is the metaphor that presents the hope of unifying Israel and Judah into one nation? They were divided after Solomon's reign.

Ch. 38) This chapter prophesies that King Gog of Tubal will invade Israel. How does God say He will punish Gog and his allies? (vv. 21-23)

Ch. 39) This chapter prophesies the destruction of Gog and the restoration of Israel.

- 1) What is the name of the place where you buried Gog and all crowds?
- 2) How long did it take to bury Gog and all crowds and purify the land?

Ch. 40) In the 25th year after Ezekiel was taken captive, he received a vision of building a new temple.  
 "And the man said to me, "Son of man, look with your eyes, and hear with your ears, and set your heart upon all that I shall show you, for you were brought here in order that I might show it to you. (.....)  
 .....  
 to the house of Israel.""

**THU) August 31**

Ch. 41) This chapter describes the sanctuary of the new temple, the alcoves, the west wing, the dimensions of the temple, and the interior decoration.

"From the floor to above the door, ( ..... )  
were carved; similarly the wall of the nave."

Ch. 42) This chapter is about the temple's chambers. Each of the two rooms in the north and south courtyards are on three levels, and these are the sacred rooms. What is this room used for? (v. 13)

Ch. 43) The glory of the Lord fills the temple and He promised to "dwell in the midst of the people of Israel forever."  
God's glory comes from the east, but what does God's voice sound like?

Ch. 44) When Ezekiel entered through the north gate of the temple, he saw that the glory of God filled the temple.  
Who were the priests who faithfully performed the duties of the sanctuary even when the Israelites did wrong and left God?

**FRI) September 1**

Ch. 45) True or False?

- 1) Part of the land of Canaan was set aside as a holy place, and a sanctuary was built there. ( ..... )
- 2) At that time, the rulers of Israel were not fair, and they cheated and robbed the people. ( ..... )
- 3) The sacrifices on the first day and the seventh day of the first month were to purify the temple. ( ..... )

Ch. 46) This chapter records the Sabbath and New Moon Day, the daily sacrifices, the prince and his inheritance, and the temple kitchen. Verses 13-15 say to prepare a lamb, flour, and oil for a burnt offering every day. When during the day do you offer burnt offerings?

(It can be applied to our lives by having time to fellowship with God before starting each day.)

Ch. 47) This chapter is about the water flowing from the temple. This water becomes a river and flows into the sea. Write down the blessings you will receive wherever this river flows. (Verses 1-12)

Ch. 48) In this chapter, the entire territory of Israel is divided among the 12 tribes.  
"And the name of the city from that time on shall be, ( ..... )."

**SAT) September 2**

Daniel Ch. 1) This chapter records the story of Daniel and his three friends who were taken to Babylon in the third year of Jehoiakim. They were to be 'separated' from the Land of Israel (vv. 3-4), to be 'educated' in Babylonian learning (v. 4), to be 'assimilated' to their way of thinking and living (v. 5), and to adopt a new Babylonian name and had to go through 'identity confusion' (vv. 6-7).

"But Daniel ( ..... )  
that he would not defile himself with the king's food, or with the wine that he drank. Therefore he asked the chief of the eunuchs to allow him not to defile himself." (v.8)

Ch. 2) After Daniel asked for time to interpret the king's dream, what did he ask the three friends to do when he returned home?

Ch. 3) Write down King Nebuchadnezzar's first words when he saw that his three friends, who had been thrown into the fire for refusing to bow down to a golden image, came out safely.

Ch. 4) Daniel interprets King Nebuchadnezzar's second dream.  
According to Daniel's interpretation, when King Nebuchadnezzar was driven out by the people and passed seven times with the wild animals, what would he see and realize that God was ruling?
