Malachi Ch. 1) In this chapter, prophet Malachi emphasizes God's love (verses 1-5) and then points out Israel's evil deeds that ignore God. (verses 6-14) Which of the following is not a sin of the priests and people of Israel?

- 1) They did not revere God and despised Him.
- 2) They did not fast at the appointed time.
- 3) Common (not holy) bread and fruit were offered at the altar.
- 4) Offerings with blemishes were offered at the altar.

Ch. 2) As recorded by Malachi 2:17 what two things that the people say to cause God to be weary of His people? (Choose two correct answers)

- 1) Everyone who does evil is good in the sight of the Lord, and he delights in them.
- 2) I guess our God is a god of war and can't do anything during peaceful times.
- 3) Where is the God of justice?
- 4) Is the Lord the God who made a covenant with our ancestors?

Ch. 3) The prophet Malachi tells us the people give full tithes and offerings as a way to return to the Lord. Where does the Lord write the names of those who fear the Lord and those who honor his name?

Ch. 4) This chapter, as the last message of the prophet Malachi, contains God's gracious promise and prophecies about John the Baptist and the Messiah. In verse 5, God promises to send Elijah (John the Baptist). What will Elijah do?

Matthew Ch. 1) What is the meaning of the name of Jesus, the son conceived by the Holy Spirit from Mary before marrying Joseph?

Ch. 2) This chapter cites three prophecies by Old Testament prophets that predicted the birth of Jesus, the Messiah. Match the following prophecies with the Old Testament citations.

Ch. 7) The Sermon on the Mount, which began in chapter 5, ends in chapter 7. As Jesus concludes his sermon, he exhorts us not to just hear the word, but to do it. It is said that a person who hears the word and puts it into practice is like having a house built on top of what?

Ch. 8) This chapter records healing ministry of Jesus. Write down all the people who have been healed by Jesus. (Only Jesus can heal all our bodies, minds, and hearts).

Ch. 9) Verse 35 records three works of Jesus while traveling through cities and villages. Write down these three ministries.

Ch. 10) Jesus selects 12 disciples, sends them out, and gives them instructions. Write the instructions relating to:

- 1) Where did He teach?

- 3) How did He minister?

Ch. 11) Here, Malachi 3:1 is quoted, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you." Who is the one who prepares the way?

Ch. 12) To the Pharisees and scribes who were seeking a sign, Jesus tells them about the sign of Jonah. Jonah was in the belly of the big fish for three days and nights. What did Jonah's incident foreshadow?

Ch. 18) In the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant, the Unforgiving Servant was forgiven 10,000 talents by his Master. But the Unforgiving Servant did not forgive Another Servant who owned him money. How much did the Other Servant owe to the Unforgiving Servant?(Reference: 1 denarius – about 4 grams of silver, a day's wages; 1 talent – about 20-40 kg of gold, 16 years' wages)

Ch. 19) The rich young man came to Jesus seeking salvation, that is, to gain eternal life, but eventually leaves Jesus. What does the young man value more than his salvation?

Ch. 20) The mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus to request that her two sons be allowed to sit at the right hand and at the left in His Kingdom. In response, Jesus spoke about service, and states the reason for which He came to this world. Please write verse 28.
