

MON) JANUARY 15 **Genesis Ch. 49 – Jacob blesses his twelve sons**

Here, Jacob blesses each of his 12 sons while looking into far future. Particularly, Jacob gives firstborn blessings to his son Judah.

“Judah, your brothers shall (.....) you; your hand shall be on the neck of your enemies; your father’s sons shall bow down before you.”
