

MON) FEBRUARY 12**Ch. 28 – Sacrifices offered at designated times**

This chapter records the sacrifices and offerings offered every day, on the Sabbath, on the first day of every month, on the Passover, the Feast of Unleavened Bread, and the Feast of Weeks.

“Command the people of Israel and say to them, ‘My offering, my food for my food offerings, my pleasing aroma, you shall be careful to offer to me at its (.....).”

(Worshiping regularly at God's designated times is an opportunity to practice giving God priority over our own priorities.)

Ch. 29 – Feast of Trumpets (verses 1-6), Day of Atonement (verses 7-11), Feast of Tabernacles (verses 12-38)

The chapter continues to teach the feasts to be observed after the land of Canaan. For each of the feasts, which months and dates are kept?

(The seventh month of the Jewish calendar is the beginning of a new year for us. Imagine worshiping completely during the first month, which marks the beginning)

Ch. 30 – Vows

This chapter records “a woman's vow.”

Ch. 31 – Vengeance on Midian

At Verse 2, God tells Moses to avenge the people of Israel on the Midianites. This is because they followed Balaam's plan (v. 16) and tempted the men of Israel, leading to the deaths of 24,000 Israelites. (Num. Ch. 25) Who was the person killed along with the five kings of Midian at this time? (He did not curse Israel but blessed Israel, but he was the one who ultimately caused temptation of that lead Israel to sin)

TUE) FEBRUARY 13 **Ch. 32 – The tribes east of the Jordan River**

This chapter records that tribes of Reuben, Gad, and half of Manasseh desired to occupy the land east of the Jordan River. When they informed of their desire to Moses, Moses rebuked them, saying, “Shall your brothers go to the war while you sit here? Why will you (.....) the heart of the people of Israel ...?”

However, tribes who wanted the land east of the Jordan River pledged to cross the land of Canaan and be with the Israelites until they each received their inheritance. (verses 15-19)

Ch. 33 – From Egypt to Moab

This chapter records the journey from the Exodus to Moab, mentioning each place. The Israelites experienced God's care at each place including guidance and sometimes strict discipline. Meditate on God who is with us at each place in our life's journey.

Ch. 34 – Boundaries of the Land of Canaan and Selection of the Person to divide the land

According to verse 2, when will the land of Canaan become their inheritance? (These words appear to tell us that we must run the race of faith to the end through obedience.)

Ch. 35 – Cities of the Levites (42 cities) and Cities of Refuge (6 cities)

This chapter records the Cities of the Levites and the Cities of Refuge. The Cities of Refuge that allowed those who unknowingly killed people to escape. If an unwitting killer goes to a city of refuge, when can he return to his own land?

WED) FEBRUARY 14 **Ch. 36 – Inheritance of a married woman**

In this chapter, through the example of Zelophehad's daughters, God teaches that marriage must be within the will of God.

“And every daughter who possesses an (.....) in any tribe of the people of Israel shall be wife to one of the clan of the tribe of her father, so that every one of the people of Israel may possess the (.....) of his fathers ... on to its own (.....).”

Deuteronomy Ch. 1 – God who embraces and acts first

In Deuteronomy, Moses teaches the Israelites (at the plains of Moab on the east side of the Jordan River) to remember God who has led them so far, and commands them to enter the land of Canaan and keep God's laws and regulations. How did God care for the Israelites during their 40-year journey in the wilderness? (Verse 31)

Ch. 2 – The Promised Land 1

In this chapter, we can see that the journey of the Israelites to take over the promised land of Canaan was in God's plan.

- 1) Verses 4-5: Do not contend with the Edomites living on Mount Seir. Mount Seir was given to (.....) as their possession.
- 2) Verse 9: Do not contend with or fight Moab. God had given (.....) to Moab.
- 3) Verse 19: Do not contend with the Ammonites. The land of the Ammonites was given as an inheritance to (.....).
- 4) Verse 31: Now I have given Sihon and (.....) to you, and from now on you may possess his land and take it as your inheritance.

Ch. 3 – The Promised Land 2

Continuing from Chapter 2, God continues to give land to Israel.

THU) FEBRUARY 15**Ch. 4 – God's Ordinances to Be Observed**

Moses reminds the Israelites of past events so "that you might know that the Lord is God; there is no other besides him." What events did Moses mention?

Ch. 5 – The Ten Commandments, repeated

The Ten Commandments (from Ch. 20 of Exodus) are taught to the second generation of Israelites. Before talking about the obligations of the Ten Commandments starting from verse 7, verse 6 first reminds them of God's grace of salvation from slavery. (God's grace is the strength and motivation to obey God's word) Write verse 6.

Ch. 6 – God's Commands – Obedience and Disobedience

What are the blessings that they will receive when they obey?

FRI) FEBRUARY 16**Ch. 8 – Do not forget the Lord in the land of Canaan.**

In this chapter, Moses records his concern that the Israelites would become complacent and forget God after entering the land of Canaan. When we live in a beautiful home, are well fed, and are financially stable and abundant (vv. 12-14), it is easy to forget God. Why? (V. 17)

Ch. 9 – The People's Disobedience

Why is God giving the Canaanite land to Israel? Find 2 reasons:

- 1) Because of Israel's righteousness
- 2) Because of the wickedness of the Canaanite peoples
- 3) To fulfill God's oath made to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob
- 4) Because of Israel's honesty

Ch. 10 – What God Requires from Israel

"And now, Israel, what does the Lord your God require of you, but to (.....) the Lord your God, to walk in all his ways, to (.....) him, to (.....) the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to (.....) the commandments and statutes of the Lord, which I am commanding you today for your good?"

SAT) FEBRUARY 17 **Ch. 12 – Worship at the place of God's choosing**

In this chapter, Moses tells the Israelites how they must serve God once they enter the land of Canaan.
